2024; 40 min music album, lecture performance, video


Bootleg Tongue is a project comprising a musical album, lecture performance and a music video.

Counting time with the rhythms of Tamte frame drums, 808s and Marfa kettledrums, *Bootleg Tongue* is an album composed of soundscapes that traverse multiple neighborhoods, trade routes, and cosmic imaginaries. It mixes field recordings of crowded streets, Youtube shorts of drumming tutorials, non-classical remixes, and Doordarshan archives to improvise with ideas around a haptics of migratory movement that bypass settled cartographies.


Performance and video loop install shot, Jangpura Studio

The video follows a signal operator – a deewani – as she moves in the hi-tech city, through bustling markets of religious replicas and demonic talismans. She follows power lines and street lamps that lead towards temples of technology. As she prepares to transmit a message, she refers to percussive instruments made of animal skin. The skin is stretchy and moist, producing a resonance that touches the signal operator's hand. She slips through the bureaucracy of grids and protocols. The deewani emerges, distorting the ordered flow of bodies and capital.

Chilika ki Machhli

Composed for an eco-tourism resort's public announcement system, the ambient soundtrack tours through a fishy space-time at Balugaon, Odisha where modernity floats like an unmanaged heap of fish bones and diapers disposed along the coast.

Intervals of conversations caught on an audio recorder by a tourist flit through excerpts of dolphin disappearances, a local deity untouched by cyclones, and fish names translated in Bangla, Odiya, Hindi and English in a fish market.

Chilika ki Machhli features the voices of Tilottama B., Shubham Sahu, Shashikanta Mohanty, Raghav Seth, Sitikanta S, Ajay, Manjeet Gogoi & motorboat tourism corporation.

Listening to Success Stories

2022; video, 19.20 min

Listening to Success Stories draws parallels between algorithmic codes, textile and instructional speech to express ideas around productivity encoded in social dynamics of control and protection.

Two hands build recursive patterns with a thread and a hook. A laptop screen plays an episode of a business reality TV show pitching wearable tech products. A voice deviates from giving crochet instructions to knit stories about tech companies that tried to patent hand gestures, a grandmother who built a granite shelf using carpentry tools and a Hindu priest who got pissed off when his morning incantations were interrupted by a washerman doing his work. Conjured as a tutorial video where directive grammar signifies a call to action, *Listening to Success Stories* tunes into the relationship between bodily and technical practices.

Listening to Success Stories was developed as part of Capture All: A Sonic Investigation, published on Disclaimer Journal, by Liquid Architecture, Melbourne and Sarai, Delhi.

Placeholder for a Whale's Itch

2022; audio album, plastic balloon, GAN image sticker, sound foam

Placeholder for a Whale's Itch is a project by a provisional working group consisting of Aarushi Surana, Aasma Tulika, Alla Semenovskaya, Lantian Xie and Kaushal Sapre. Placeholder was imagined as a machine for generating a brawl-crowd of discourse and co-producing formulations in various materialities and affective registers, including texts, speech acts, scenography, soundtracks, listening environments, virtual walkthroughs, simulations, whale conspiracies among others.

The whale comes into the modern consciousness as fuel source, then gets entangled in undersea cables while trying to scratch an itch. It becomes a measure of scale, a placeholder to read and grasp a world full of fishy mathematics. It gets hauled up on a beach in Pakistan and travels with a Hungarian circus. It then becomes a cargo logistical problem. *Placeholder for a Whale's Itch* mixes polyphonic voices, GSM interference noise and muzak to weave propositions around entanglement with the world.




I Dreamt Before Sleeping


A Hyperlinked Walk

2020; Interactive text-based game

Hyperlinked walk is a virtual walk in Beirut that navigating military zones scattered across the city. When the task of navigating with Google Maps became difficult as it was unable to identify the zones, what remained were conversations with the security personnel at the gates. An inaccurate text-to-image algorithm generates synthetic memories to supplement the gaps in visual recollection.

Automated transcriptions

2020; 4 min looped video + audio

Automated transcriptions involves two encounters that use Google Live Transcribe to refuse recording a news reporter's speech, and to record the recollection of a legal document.

Encounter #1:

A news reporter's voice blares through youtube on a laptop. An app is transcribing the reporter's speech. A group of people interrupt the transcription, and invoke the algorithm's interpretation of environmental sounds. A turkish song is sung, papers were torn, pigeon calls mimicked and an arabic lullaby is sung towards the speech.

Encounter #2:

A group visits the Lebanese foreign security building to sign a confidential document titled 'conditions of responsibility'. Voices recall the contents of the document, which are recorded using a transcription app. While all the voices described the same document, transcription errors inverted the legal weight of the original document to assume absurd and humorous renditions.


Search: What's Happening?

2020; Twitter feeds, Natural Language Processing library, Python code

Search: What's Happening?' is a procedurally generated series of texts that recount events occurring between 6th and 12th September 2020. Twitter feeds were extracted from a search for what's happening in India, and were used as a database for artificially generated verses. The algorithms were programmed to structure sentences tuned to the syntactic criteria of news reporting language; by laying emphasis on who, what, when, where and why. Each line reflected these prompts and registered them in past tense to freeze an instance of informational chaos fueled by reactionary media.



radio roohafza is an internet radio station that streams sound from a self-hosted server in Delhi, India.

radio roohafza is hosted on a low cost, low tech web server system developed using open source networking software running on a consumer internet line. Its physical infrastructure consists of old laptops and single board computers that share messy tabletops with a happy meal toy, crochet hooks and a money plant among other things. It heats up during the summer months and goes down with the occasional power cut. You can tell from the sound of its cooling fan if it has got visitors, or perhaps just a botnet sniffing around. This system is perpetually online, and shares its architecture with our home network. The interest is in the capacity of this infrastructure to host the world.
